TRINITY SUNDAY—God's Three Ways of Being

Many of us have a particular image of God. When we think of God, we may see him in terms of the Sacred Heart or maybe our image of God is of a white-bearded grandfather-type figure who looks on us from a distance. But whatever our image of God, how often do we think of God in terms of Trinity, as three persons? Yet every time we bless ourselves, every time we begin and end our prayers in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, that is what we are doing. We are acknowledging the Triune nature of Our God, that our God is three-in-one. One writer describes the Trinity as 'God's three ways of being there'. God as Father and creator is 'in us', Jesus as Son is 'with us', and the Holy Spirit 'enables us'. The Trinity is saying something to us about God's inmost nature. God is too big and complicated for our minds to grasp completely. But even though He cannot be fully explained we admire and believe in Him. It is even a deeper mystery why this infinitely intelligent and all-powerful Creator has freely chosen to love us. Another mysterious question is: How in the world did we ever get invited to His home, to live with Him forever? What a lovely mystery!



TUESDAY 13th JUNE
Feast of St. Anthony of Padua
St. Anthony of Padua is one of the Catholic Church's most popular saints. Saint Anthony of Padua, patron saint of lost and stolen articles, was a powerful Franciscan preacher and teacher. He's typically portrayed holding the child Jesus—or a lily—or a book—or all three—in his arms. Many people give alms to St. Anthony in thanksgiving to God for blessings received through the prayers of St. Anthony. St. Anthony of Padua's life is what every Christian's life is meant to be; a steady courage to face the ups and downs of life, the call to love and forgive, to be concerned for the needs of others, to deal with crisis great and small, and to have our feet solidly on the ground of total trusting love and dependence on God. St Anthony is beloved throughout the world and is responsive to all people and all needs. His intercessory powers before our God are amazing.

Novena to the Sacred Heart commences on Thursday June 15th at 10am and concludes on Friday 23rd
The origin of the idea of praying for a special intention for nine days is very attractive and worth thinking about - it comes from the alleged length of time that Mary and the eleven remaining disciples spent praying together in the upper room, waiting for the Spirit to come upon them at Pentecost. In our imitation of them in these nine days we'll surely be in good company, especially with Mary, the one who shows us what our attitude in prayer should be: she always trusted, despite confusion; she continued to hope, despite the seeming darkness. The disciples were a small community of fragile yet hopeful, trust of confusion, yet deep desire within their hearts. In short, they were probably very much like ourselves On each day of the novena, try to have a few quiet moments with yourself or with others to reflect. Always end with the Novena Prayer and include in it any intention you would like to make.
