The Feast of Pentecost

The Feast of Pentecost is an anniversary and birthday of the Church. At the original Pentecost, the Spirit of God's love came to Christ's disciples to bind them together as a group of people who were committed to establish His kingdom on earth. This was the birth of the Church. But now Pentecost is like a wedding anniversary: it is a celebration of God's loving spirit bringing us together in worship of God and the care of each other. It reminds us that the Holy Spirit has always been with the Church - guiding, healing, helping, challenging and making it holy. Pentecost is calling us to commit ourselves again to the shared responsibility of helping all God's people to serve Him. On Pentecost, we think of the Holy Spirit and of the renewed vigour and drive that came to the apostles on that day. They were waiting in hope for something. Most of us look back on the moments when we were expecting something special. At Mass, we pray in the 'Our Father' that God's Kingdom may come, then we spell out what it means when we ask in the prayer that follows that we may be delivered from evil, live in peace and be free from anxiety as we wait in hope for Jesus.

3. Festival of Families (25th August), a special cultural style event with a prayerful and joyful atmosphere.
