Baptism—The Beginning of the Journey

Merely presenting children for Baptism is not enough. Parents must hand on the Christian values system. This of course, presumes they have faith. Children imitate their parents in many ways and that includes their value system. If parents don't have faith, the seed at Baptism will not grow. There must be a reasonable hope that the child will be brought up in the faith. If it is absent, baptism should be delayed and an explanation given to parents.

When a child is baptised it is presupposed that not only must parents be people of faith but also the sponsors. Being human, our faith is not perfect; It needs nourishment—regular attendance at Sunday Mass is one sure way to nourish our faith. Absence weakens it.

In the ceremony of Baptism parents are reminded that they are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith. They do this by example—what they say and do. Therefore, it is important that children grow up in a household of faith.

Reading and Explanation of the Word of God

When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel. Therefore, the readings from the Word of God are to be listened to reverently by everyone, for they are an element of the greatest importance in the Liturgy. Although in the readings from Sacred Scripture, the Word of God is addressed to all people of whatever era and is understandable to them, a fuller understanding and a greater efficaciousness of the word nevertheless fostered by a living commentary on the word, that is, by the Homily, as part of the liturgical action.
