Day for Life is celebrated yearly by the Catholic Church in Ireland, Scotland and England and Wales. It is a day dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition: www.dayforlife.org. Some years ago, when celebrating Mass in honour of St Raymond Nonnatus, the Patron Saint of expectant mothers and midwives, Pope Francis spoke simply and beautifully about what promoting a culture of life really means: 'Jesus teaches us to care for life because it is the image of God, who is absolute life. We cannot announce anything else but life, from the beginning to the end. All of us must care for life and cherish life with tenderness. To give life is to open the heart, and to care for life is to expend one's self in tenderness and warmth for others and to have concern in our hearts for others. Caring for life from the beginning to the end. What a simple thing, what a beautiful thing, So, go forth and don't be discouraged.

Therese was born in France in 1873. She lived for ten years as a **Carmelite** nun. She never went on missions, or founded a religious order. A book was published after her death—a brief version of her journal called "The Story of a Soul". Within 28 years of her death the public demand was so great that she was canonized. Generations of Catholics have admired this young saint, calling her the "Little Flower", and found in her short life more inspiration for their own lives than in volumes by theologians. **You are all invited to bring a rose with you to Mass on Monday October 2nd when all roses will be blessed.**
